



THE MOSQUE





My name is Sidra Alrajab. I am from Syria, but I live in Canada. I will tell you about the mosque. A mosque is very important for every Muslim. When Muslim men or women pray, they have to pray in a certain direction. The direction is called the *janas* direction, towards where our prophet was born. There is a word in Arabic, zakat, which means charity to Muslims when they go to the mosque. There are five pillars of Islam that Muslims have to do. If you can't do one of them, the haj, it's okay.

When Muslims go to the mosque, they give money for the poor. Sometimes, some people bring food for the poor people. Some people, who have clothes that they don't want, bring them to the mosque for those who have little.

Every Friday, men go to pray at the mosque. When men pray, they must wear clothes that are below their knees. When women go to the mosque to pray, they are not allowed to show any part of their body. They are not even allowed to show their toes. Every Sunday, my family goes to the mosque for Sunday school to learn about Islam, the Quran, and Arabic. Anyone can go to the mosque, no matter their culture or religion. If you go, the rule is that you are learning.

My name is Ava Caines. I am a Grade 6 student at Mary Queen of Peace Elementary in St. John's. One evening our family was playing a game of cards and I thought of a great art project to make an ordinary deck of cards much more interesting to look at.
